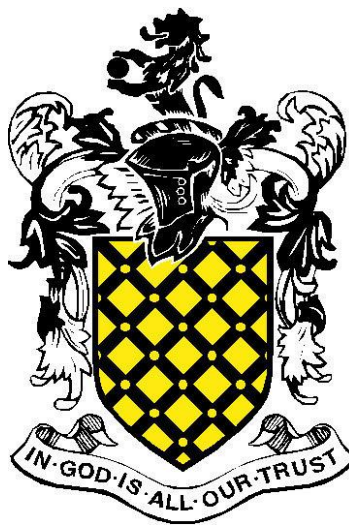

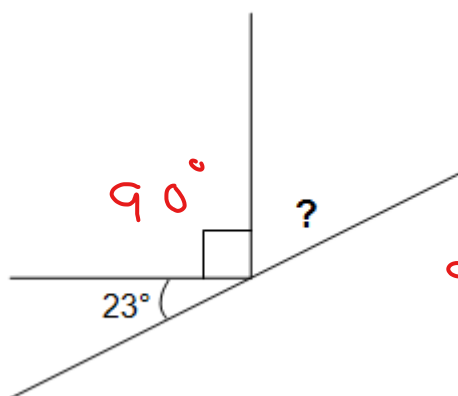
A group of adults and children goes to the theme park for a cost of £44.

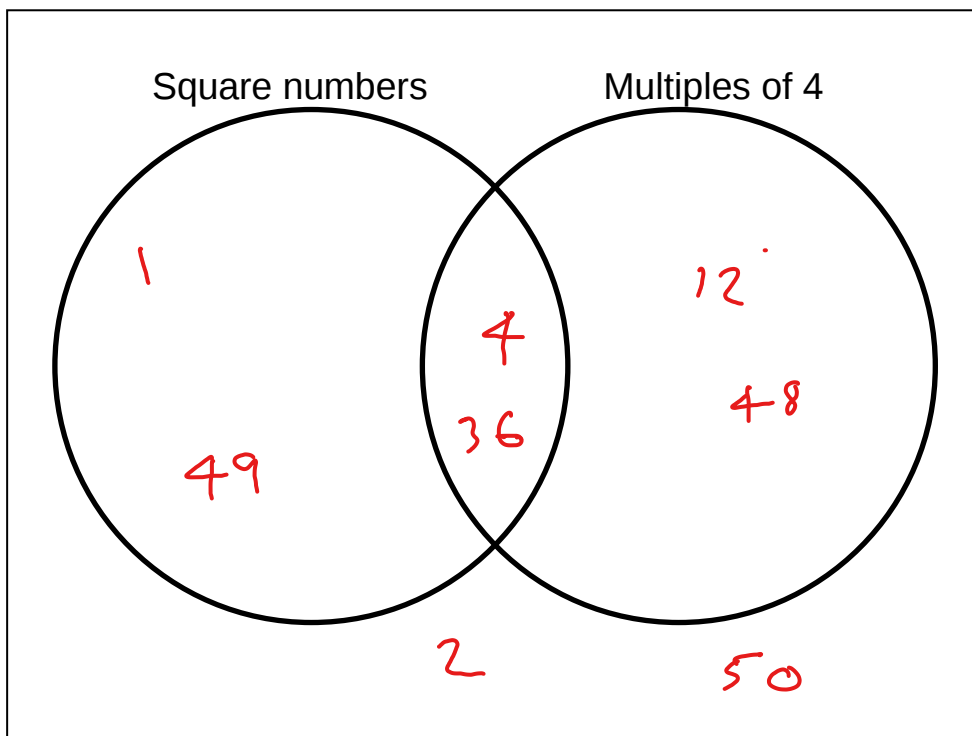

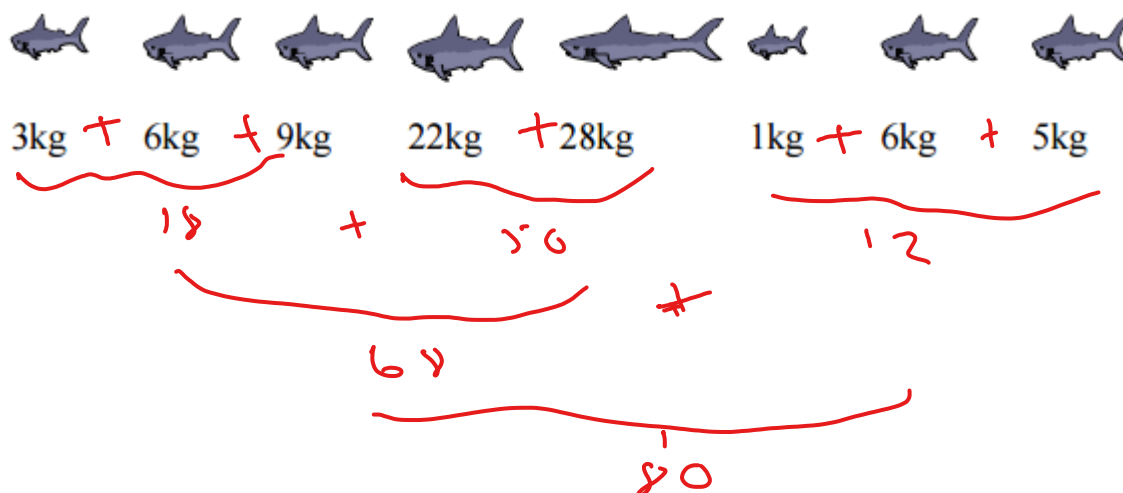

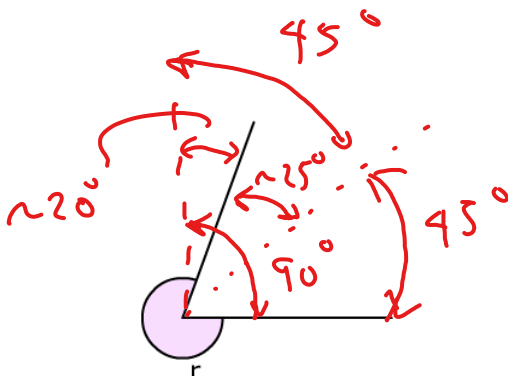

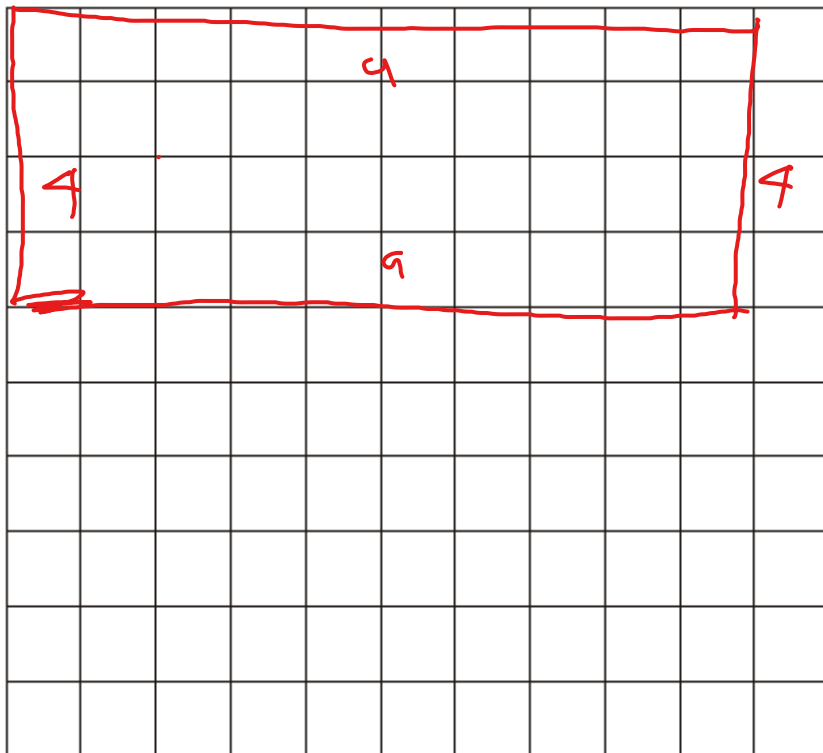

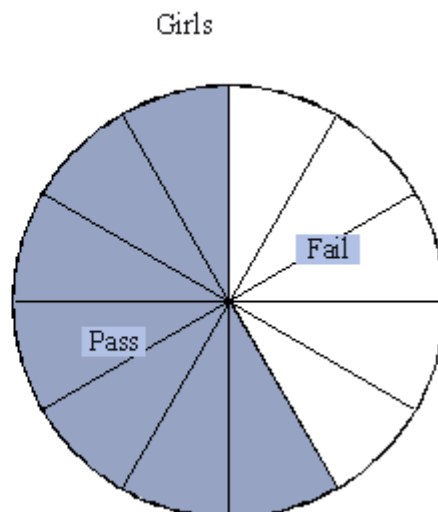
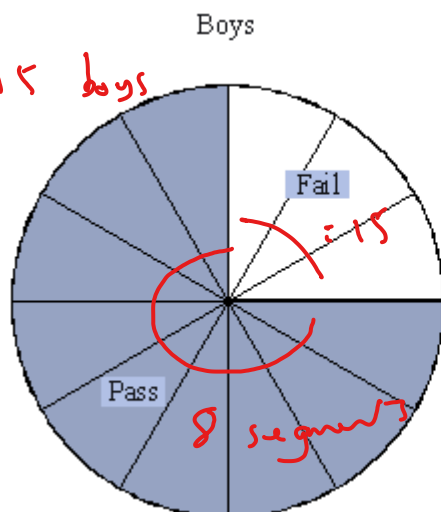
22. The pie charts show the results of a cycling test taken by all pupils in year 7.

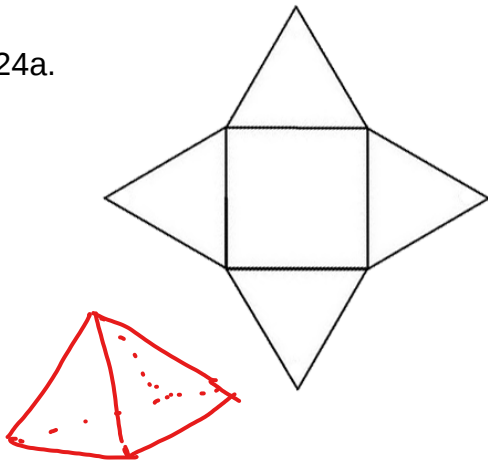

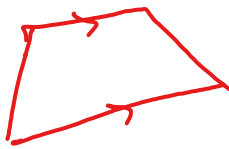


Which 3D shape is this the net of?

$$\textcircled{1} \quad 2a + b = 120 \quad \text{pence}$$

$$\textcircled{2} \quad a + 2b = 135 \quad \text{pence}$$

multiply $\textcircled{2}$ by 2

$$2a + 4b = 270$$

Substitute for $2a$ in $\textcircled{1}$

$$270 - 4b + b = 120$$

$$150 - 3b = 0$$

$$3b = 150$$

$$b = 50$$

From $\textcircled{1}$

$$2a + 50 = 120$$

$$2a = 70$$

$$a = 35$$

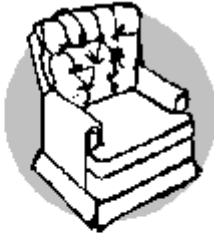

26 Zain wants to buy **two** chairs.

Three shops advertise the same luxury chair.
Each shop has a special offer.

$\frac{30}{100} \times 600 = 180$
Price = $600 - 180 = 420$
 $\pounds 840$ for two chairs

Shop A
Chair – normal price £600
Special Offer – 30% off normal price



Shop B
Chair – normal price £550
Special Offer – $\frac{1}{5}$ off normal price

Shop C
Chair – normal price £820
Special Offer – buy one get one free

$\frac{1}{5} \times 550 = 110$
Price = $550 - 110 = 440$ for one chair
 ~~$\pounds 880$ for two chairs~~

$\pounds 820$ for two chairs

At which shop is the price of the two chairs the cheapest?

You **must** show your working.

Shop A

$$\begin{aligned} &30\% \text{ of } 600 \\ &= \frac{30}{100} \times 600 \\ &= 180 \\ \text{Price for one} &= 600 - 180 \\ &= \pounds 420 \\ \text{Price for two} &= 420 \times 2 \\ &= \underline{\underline{\pounds 840}} \end{aligned}$$

Shop B

$$\begin{aligned} &\frac{1}{5} \times 550 = 110 \\ \text{Price for one} &= 550 - 110 \\ &= 440 \\ \text{Price for two chairs} &= 440 \times 2 \\ &= \underline{\underline{\pounds 880}} \end{aligned}$$

Shop C

$$\begin{aligned} &\text{Price for two} \\ &\text{chairs} \\ &= \underline{\underline{\pounds 820}} \end{aligned}$$
